Pendergast Principal and National Surety Corporation, New York City, N.Y. Sureties and jointly and severally acknowledged themselves to owe the United States of America the sum of Fifteen hundred Dollars, to be levied on their goods and chattels, land and tenements, if default be made in the condition following, to-wit:

THE CONDITION of this Recognizance, is such, that if the said T. J. Pendergast Principal shall personally appear before the District Court of the United States in and for the Western District of Missouri, on the 19th day of July, 1940, to be begun and held at the City of Kansas City, at 9:30 o'clock A. M., and from time to time thereafter to which the case may be continued and then and there answer the charge of having, from January, 1935, continuously to July 13, A.D. 1940, within said District, in violation of Section 88, Title 18, U.S.C.A. of the United States unlawfully, conspired together and with other unknow persons to defraud the United States, by interfering with the orderly and lawful functioning of the Judiciary Department thereof, in the case of the American Insurance Company vs. the Superintendent of Insurance of the State of Missouri, then pending before the United States District Court for the Western District of Missouri and there abide the judgment of said Court, and not depart without leave thereof, then this Recognizance to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.

Illegible] before the United States District Court for the Western District of Missouri and then and there abide the judgment of said Court, and not depart without leave thereof, then this Recognizance to be void, otherwise to remain in full force and virtue.
